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Introduction

The American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS®) promotes safe, quality patient health care by elevating the discipline of specialty medicine through board certification. ABMS board certification serves two primary roles:

- As an independent evaluation of a physician's or medical specialist's knowledge and skills to practice safely and effectively in a specialty
- As a trusted credential patients can rely upon when selecting a provider for their needs

The value of board certification by an ABMS Member Board is that it provides an ongoing independent evaluation to assure that the specialty physician workforce:

- Is skilled and clinically competent
- Develops their specialty expertise throughout their careers
- Meets the standards of practice established by their peers

It is demonstrated by the ongoing public interest in seeking out board certified physicians and medical specialists (known as diplomates) and by the number of hospitals and other health care organizations that make board certification a key qualification for medical staff privileges.

About this Report

The ABMS Board Certification Report for 2021–2022 provides a summary of key discoveries from the ABMS Board Certification Database and other information provided by the 24 ABMS Member Boards. In aggregate, this report offers a snapshot as of June 30, 2022, including:

- The official list of the specialty and subspecialty certificates approved by ABMS for issue by the ABMS Member Boards.*
- Basic requirements physicians and medical specialists must meet for initial certification and continuing certification.
- The number of new specialty and subspecialty certificates issued in the last 10 years.
- Distribution of board certified diplomates by ABMS Member Board, specialty, and state.

The ABMS Board Certification Database is a primary source for professional certification verification. Verifying a physician's or medical specialist's board certification is made possible through ABMS <u>public resources</u> and <u>professional services</u>.

ABMS Board Certified Diplomates: A Population Overview

The 2021–2022 ABMS Board Certification Report reflects a growing population of board certified physicians and specialists (also known as diplomates) who use board certification to demonstrate their specialty expertise and continued commitment to provide safe, high-quality, and effective care.

The report shows that as of June 30, 2022 there were 978,425 individuals (see <u>Table 3C</u>) with an active board certification in one or more of the 40 specialties and 89 subspecialties approved by ABMS (see <u>Table 1A</u> and <u>Table 1B</u>). Figure 1 shows the total number of board certified diplomates per ABMS Member Board. The numbers in the table represent distinct counts. A diplomate is counted once per Member Board.



Geographic Distribution of ABMS Member Board Diplomates

Geographic distribution of the ABMS Member Board diplomates was computed using data from the ABMS Board Certification Database, along with United States Census Bureau's American Community Survey (2020) data for population estimates.

The state totals as of June 30, 2022 in <u>Table 3C</u> provide information about the distribution of diplomates by Member Board and state. Figure 2 shows the diplomate distribution per 10,000 at the state level.

Figure 2: ABMS Member Board Certified Diplomates per 10,000 Population by State





Age and Gender Breakdown

The breakdown of age and gender for the diplomate population continues to change over time. As shown below, the younger cohort shows a even distribution between men and women in contrast to older cohorts. At this time, 30.2% of all active diplomates are women, while 64.8% are men. Note that 5.6% of diplomates are unknown. Currently, the median age of an ABMS board certified diplomate is 55 and the mean age is 56.9.

Certifications Awarded

ABMS Member Boards awarded 38,901 new specialty certificates (see Table 3A) and 16,100 new subspecialty certificates (see Table 3B) to physicians and medical specialists during 2021. In looking at the number of active certifications held, many ABMS Member Board diplomates choose to maintain more than one certification to further demonstrate additional specialized medical expertise. Figure 4 shows that about 25% of ABMS Member Board diplomates have at least two active certificates.

In reviewing the number of new specialty certificates issued (see Table 3A) and new subspecialty certificates issued during the past 10 years (see Table 3B), Figure 6 identifies two specialty and subspecialty certificates that have the highest increase over 10 years. The specialties of Internal Medicine and Family Medicine saw an increase of 36% and 35% respectively. Certificates awarded in the subspecialty of Endocrinology, Diabetes and Metabolism from the American Board of Internal Medicine, also saw an increase in the number of certificates awarded.



Continuing Certification

The ABMS Board Certification Database shows that as of June 30, 2022, there were 690,518 diplomates participating in continuing certification. Continuing certification (formerly known as Maintenance of Certification (MOC)) is the ongoing process of board certification that simultaneously supports diplomates in keeping their knowledge and skills current while validating their increasing expertise in a specialty.

The process has developed during the last 20 years. Initial certification is the entry point for diplomates to participate in continuing professional development through focused, relevant, and accessible activities and assessments (see <u>Table 2C</u>). Board certified diplomates are required to participate in ongoing activities to maintain certification. Some do not however, because the requirement was not in place when they were first certified. The ABMS Member Boards strongly encourage these individuals to participate voluntarily. Figure 7 shows the increase of the number of ABMS Member Board diplomates participating in continuing certification.

It reflects an evolution of practice that occurs following initial certification and is relevant to continuing certification. For example, a physician may focus his or her practice on work in the hospital setting or concentrate on specific patient populations, conditions, and/or specialized procedures that emerge as medicine evolves.

- (1) Training must be accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), the accrediting body for post-MD or post-DO medical training programs in the United States. Contact the board regarding other credit accepted.
- (2) The ABMS Eligibility Policy for Subspecialty Certification, effective January 1, 2018, limits the period of time that may elapse between a specialist's training and achievement of initial certification in a subspecialty.ABMS Member Boards that did not have an existing policy in place have established a transition plan. Member Boards marked with an asterisk (*) had board eligibility policies in place prior to the effective date of the ABMS policy. Their board eligible periods align with the principles of the policy.
- (3) ABPath eligibility period starts from the completion of subspecialty training or primary certification, whichever is later.
- (4) ABTS requires diplomates to apply within one year of completing training.
- (5) ABU requires applicants to complete the examination process within six years with up to three attempts to take the examination.
- (6) ABOHNS and ABPS diplomates may be eligible for Micrographic Dermatologic Surgery certification through the ABD upon completion of additional requirements.
- (7) Pediatric Dermatology training is accredited by ABD.
- (8) ABOS allows a maximum of nine years to complete certification in Surgery of the Hand. This policy also applies to Sports Medicine, pending review by the board.

Clinical-presentation-based assessment involves questions related to the assessment, treatment, and follow up for patients presenting with common clinical problems in the specialty. Customized to Practice involves Member Boards allowing physicians the ability to select among topic areas based on practice setting and/or patient mix.
- (4) The ABMS Portfolio Program offers an option for organizations to support physician involvement in quality, performance, and process improvement (QI/PI) initiatives at their institution and award physicians Improvement in Medical Practice credit for continuing certification.
- (5) Options vary by certificate: yearly question-based format for some subspecialties.
- (6) Assessment integrated with Lifelong Learning and Self-Assessment.
- (7) Implemented in 2021 for Clinical Informatics certificate, 2023 for other certificates.
- (8) Formative feedback provided; offer second chance to answer items.
- (9) Customized to practice; formative feedback provided; offer second chance to answer items.
- (10) Customized to practice with feedback; CME assigned for areas of substandard performance.



stress, and increase autonomy in making life decisions, especially with regard to family and parental leave. Starting in July 2021, all ABMS Member Boards with training programs of two or more years duration will allow for a minimum of six

weeks away once during training for purposes of parental, caregiver, and medical leave, without exhausting time allowed for

vacation or sick leave and without requiring an extension in training. Member Boards must communicate when a leave of absence will require an official extension to help mitigate the negative impact on a physician's career trajectory that a training extension may have, such as delaying a fellowship or moving into a full, salaried position.

The development of the new ABMS Policy on Parental, Caregiver and Family Leave was initiated following a report from the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education's (ACGME's) Council of Review Committee Residents in June 2019. ABMS and ACGME cosponsored a workshop on resident and fellow parental and family leave this past February that brought together more than 80 multiclisciplinary stakeholders to explore this issue and make recommendations for improvement. Following the workshop, an ABMS Task Force on Parental Leave was established to develop the policy.

The newly approved policy offers ABMS Member Boards the flexibility to create a parental, family, or medical leave protocol that best suits the training required for their specialty and/or subspecialty. <u>Read more</u>.
